Fredricksen Library has had a wonderful year.

- The library won the John Cotton Dana Award, which is the Oscar AND the Pulitzer of the library world. Only eight of these are given out yearly worldwide.

While these are certainly grand achievements, Fredricksen's biggest contribution to the world in general has been of a quieter sort.

The library generates good. Fredricksen's writers' group, funded as a memorial to writer Natalie Craumer, published its first book this year. The new eBooks Kiosk and eBooks Hub have helped 100s of folks learn to use their electronic devices and to create – music, writing, art – with them.
