
Members 1st Presents Building a Better Bosler Check

Law Library Moving to Bosler

Later this spring Bosler Memorial Library will become the home to the Cumberland County Law Library. As part of a cooperative agreement with the County, the Library will house the physical County Law Library Collection and also provide access to the County's Westlaw database. This will significantly increase the hours of access to residents who wish to use the Law Library, which has traditionally been available only during the hours that the County Courthouse is open.

Bosler Library's Information Services staff will be able to provide basic legal reference and assist patrons in the use of the law collection. As an even greater benefit, much of the collection will circulate, meaning that items can be checked out and that patrons of the other libraries in the Cumberland County Library System will be able to have the items sent to their library for use. The Westlaw database will also be available through any of the libraries in the County. This means that no resident of Cumberland County is more than nine miles from access to the County Law Library.
