A Friendly Reminder



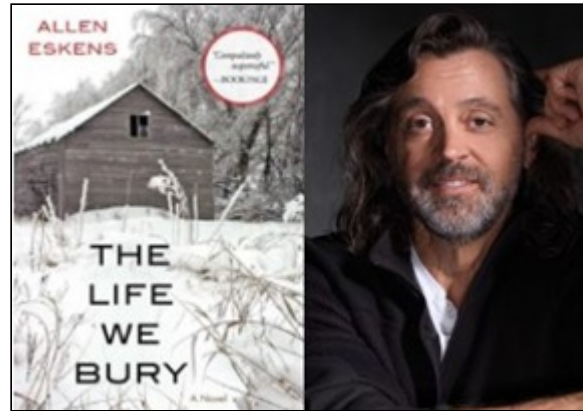

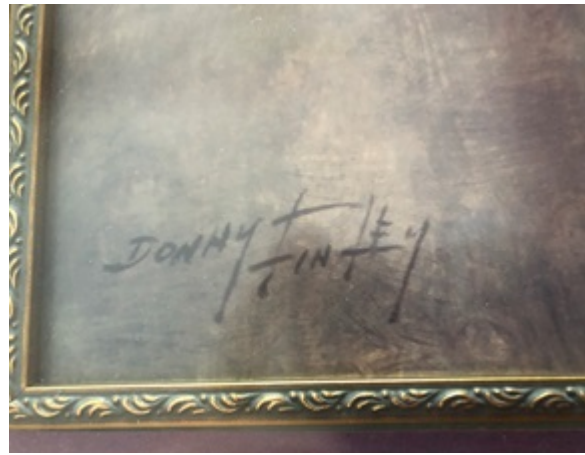

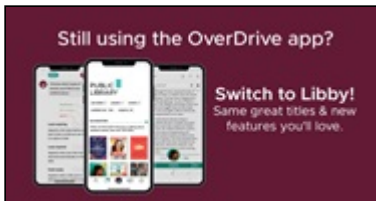
