

Liberty Tree

America250PA, in partnership with the Pennsylvania Freemasons, is planting certified Liberty Trees in commemoration of the United States' 250th anniversary in 2026.

The original Liberty Trees were gathering places for Sons of Liberty during the American Revolutionary War, and one will be planted in each of the 67 counties. Trees will be planted each Spring and Fall beginning now through 2026.

Our Liberty Tree is planted on the Branch Creek side of the library, across the bridge.



A Summer Read



Library Duck Derby Supports Library Programs

Nearly 300 rubber ducks raced down Branch Creek during the Coy Public Library of Shippensburg's fifth annual Duck Derby Saturday, which is held each year in conjunction with the Bloom Festival.

About 30 people came to watch the race on a semi-cool and drizzly afternoon in town. Saturday was a busy day in Shippensburg that also featured the Chamber of Commerce's annual Bloom Fest and the D.O.I.T. Sidewalk Chalk Art Contest.

Racing Ducks numbered 1 through 152 were purchased at the library circulation desk and Racing Ducks numbered 400 through 519 were purchased at the library's BloomFest table.

The course was inspected by 3 local drakes and 2 hens mid-morning. The library's racing ducks were launched from the King Street bridge, the crowd watching the race from the library footbridge cheered and took pictures and video, and a few moments later the three speediest ducks from the raft crossed the finish line!


