
National Inventor's Month



Stop by the library this month and learn about a new inventor, or perhaps even find inspiration to become an inventor yourself!










Liberty Tree

America250PA, in partnership with the Pennsylvania Freemasons, is planting certified Liberty Trees in commemoration of the United States' 250th anniversary in 2026.

The original Liberty Trees were gathering places for Sons of Liberty during the American Revolutionary War, and one will be planted in each of the 67 counties. Trees will be planted each Spring and Fall beginning now through 2026.


Our Liberty Tree is planted on the Branch Creek side of the library, across the bridge.






