





October is Fire Prevention Month

Participate in National Fire Prevention Month by:

- Developing a fire escape plan with everyone in your household and practice it at least twice a year.
- Installing smoke alarms in your home, on every level, and outside each sleeping area.
 Test them once a month and replace the batteries at least once a year if required.
 Teach children what smoke alarms sound like and what they should do if they hear one.
- Make sure all household members know two ways to escape from every room.
- Establish a family meeting spot outside.

Upcoming Greenspace


We've received a number of questions about our greenspace.

This space is meant to be used by the library and the community for both programming and simply enjoying the beauty of Middle Spring Creek and our downtown area.

American Girl: Read to Pets






