

Bosler Memorial Library is announcing an exciting new endeavor. Beginning in September 2017, the Library will be working with local community members to introduce the Carlisle Institute for Lifelong Learning. The Institute, geared at providing programs and courses on a wide range of topics, will combine the already high-quality programming provided by the Library with multi-session courses provided by volunteer presenters from a variety of backgrounds.

The Carlisle Institute for Lifelong Learning is the brainchild of a group of community members who seek to create an environment that engages adults in learning at any age and stage of life.

“The library was the ideal institution to bring this idea to life,” says Katherine McFarland, curriculum committee member for the Institute. “After all, libraries are institutions of lifelong learning.”

The startup of the Institute is being funded through a donation by Russell W. Coe, a long-time library supporter.

All of the Library’s existing adult programming will become part of the Institute. The Institute will also offer more in-depth courses for those who wish to dig deeper into a particular topic.

“The Institute is open to anyone,” says Vallie Edenbo, Community Relations Coordinator for the Library. “There will be programs and courses where people can enjoy, engage and explore. This isn’t a formal academic program. This is an expansion of the Library’s public programs to provide access to information for everyone in the community.”

Registration will be required for some of the programs and courses. All programs and courses will be free of charge, but donations will be accepted to support the Institute.






International Games Week

This mission is carried out in part by placing wreaths on veterans' graves and having simultaneous ceremonies at over 500 locations in the USA and 24 offshore sites. This year Wreaths Across America day is **December 16, 2017**. Our location is Indiantown Gap National Cemetery in Annville, PA. All are invited to attend this very moving ceremony and help place wreaths if you wish.

Each wreath sponsorship is \$15. Of that, the Friends of the Bosler Memorial Library receives \$5. We will have the Wreath Sponsorship Form available in the Bookery and in the Library beginning Oct. 1, 2017. “Joan Jurgensen Day” on September 5

In honor of Joan Jurgensen, an active member of the Friends of Bosler and longtime Library donor, September 5, 2017 will be Joan Jurgensen Day at Bosler Memorial Library. Joan died earlier this year at the age of 76. After having served for many years on the board of the Friends of Bosler and spearheading the Friends’ successful annual gala fundraisers, she was granted emeritus status by the Friends Board. Together with her friend Nancy George, another extraordinary volunteer who led both the Friends of Bosler and the Bosler Memorial Library boards for many years, Joan made many significant contributions to the successes of Bosler Memorial Library and the Friends of Bosler.

In deciding on a day to honor Joan, her husband Craig selected September 5th he said, “because it’s the first day of public school - and libraries are all about learning - in the library, in school and elsewhere.” He took this picture of Joan and Nancy at Nancy’s flower shop at Christmastime one year. He said it “reveals how personally and effectively Joan and Nancy worked and planned together.”

In June 2017, Bosler Library staff installed the James R. Washington, Jr. Memorial Reading Corner at Hope Station. The collection is part of a Library initiative known as Read and Return: Books in Hands of Young Readers. The Library supplied the books and bookshelves and will visit routinely to maintain the collection. A teen collection may be added in the future. Hope Station’s afterschool program participants will have access to the collection and are able to borrow a book at any time.
