Music at Bosler presents Abby and Micah Dunn

Drawing on influences that range from classic country, old-time, bluegrass, and gospel to direct their songs, Abby and Micah Dunn strive to bring the timelessness of traditional Americana music to a new relevance for today. Their music is driven by harmony singing and accompanied by a wide variety of instrumentation ranging from clawhammer banjo and mandolin, to electric guitar.



Throughout the years, Abby and Micah have played in various bands and musical collaborations, and they began playing together as a duo in 2007. In 2016, they added Matt Miller on upright bass into the mix and as a trio, they are continuing their musical exploration into the foundations of American country roots music.

Nicholas Ryan Over Foundation Donates AEDs to Bosler

Thanks to the Nicholas Ryan Over Foundation, Bosler Memorial Library now has two AEDs available on-site if the need ever arises. An automated external defibrillator (AED) is a medical device used to "shock" the heart of a victim of a sudden cardiac arrest back into rhythm. With an average of 800 visitors coming into the Library each day, the likelihood of someone needing the use of an AED here at Bosler is higher than at many other public places. With staff trained in first aid and CPR, it's helpful to also have an AED available on each floor of the library. We are grateful to the Nicholas Ryan Over Foundation for their generosity in making this donation of two AEDs and cabinets.

We join with Project SHARE in expressing our thanks to the approximately 100 volunteers who helped to design the curriculum, teach the kids, cook, deliver food, and assist with field trips. Bosler Memorial Library is proud to

be a part of this great program, which recently earned a Gold Medal Award from the USDA and PDE.

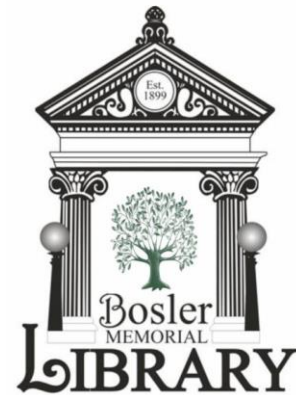
