



A Year-End Message from the Executive Director

2018 has been an eventful year at Bosler Memorial Library. We have successfully completed our first full year of the Carlisle Institute for Lifelong Learning and created our Growing Learner's Library. In addition, we had a successful Summer Learning Challenge and a great Comic Con. Our second Celebrate the Book Week held in the library was not only a wonderful experience, but also saw a 22% increase in attendance. We are constantly looking for ways to



expand our efforts and provide the citizens of our community with new and exciting collections, programs, and services that can help them continue to learn and grow throughout their lives.

Targeting community needs is crucial when it comes to reaching out to potential partners. Building strong partnerships is one way to meet this goal. This year we established strategic partnerships with Cumberland County Adult Probation and Parole, Project SEARCH, and A4td, while working to strengthen partnerships with existing partners such as Hope Station and Project Share. And, we have more partnerships in the works.

We are starting out strong in 2019 with and expanded set of programs for the Spring Carlisle Institute for Lifelong Learning including the introduction of the first Lavery Speaker Series program. These programs address the five critical literacies for lifelong success: Basic, Civic/Social, Financial, Health, and Information Literacy.
