### Thank you!

A great big THANK YOU to everyone who has responded with a gift to the Bosler Memorial Library Exercise Your Mind annual fund campaign so far! By December 31, 2018, more than 380 of you donated a record \$54,451 in direct response to the appeal! In addition, you helped us meet the McCormick Family Foundation matching grant challenge for an additional \$7,500!

The Exercise Your Mind campaign, which began in November 2018, is raising funds to ensure that your Carlisle area neighbors have access to reading materials, educational programs and community activities to help keep their minds active and engaged. Even though the Library receives annual support through the County library tax, state support has remained stagnant, and these two sources together account for less than 55% of the Library's annual budget. The Bosler Memorial Library Pop-Up Art Studio, a collaboration with Carlisle Arts Learning Center (CALC) was on hiatus but is returning this month on a different day.



Starting on Saturday, January 26, library visitors may come create art here at the library each month on the fourth Saturday of the month, from 1:00 to 4:00 pm. The aim of the monthly program is to provide a space for artists to work and for people who are interested in art to have a space to explore different art media.

## New Partnership with County Adult Probation and Parole

This month, Bosler Memorial Library is beginning a new partnership to provide children's books to Cumberland County Adult Probation and Parole. We will be delivering 100 children's books quarterly. Probation and Parole will then distribute the books to their clients who have children living at home.



### **New Databases from POWER Library**

International in scope, **LitFinder** covers all time periods and contains literature content, including more than 140,000 full-text poems, 840,000 poem citations and excerpts, 7,100 full-text short stories and novels, 3,800 full-text essays published in the 16th-20th centuries, 2,400 full-text speeches, and 1,250 full-text plays. It also includes biographies, work summaries, photographs, and a glossary.


