New and Exciting Library Updates!



Bosler has recently installed a new book drop at the front of the library on West High St.! This new book drop has been installed for the convenience of all our patrons coming into the front entrance of the library. This book drop is dedicated in memory of Jean Weidner Stambaugh, a Bosler volunteer, by Glenn Stambaugh.

Thanks to a mini-grant from the Partnership for Better Health last year, Bosler now has a robust collection of books to help people struggling with addiction and other mental health issues. Library staff spent the \$5,000 grant on 344 new books over the last twelve months. These new items are now in the



nonfiction area of the library on the second floor and have already circulated 483 times. Several of them have multiple holds on them, meaning that they are in great demand by library patrons. On behalf of all of our library patrons struggling with addiction and mental health issues, we are grateful for the funding for this project provided by the Partnership for Better Health.

A Tribute to Ann Rhoades

The Bosler family mourns the loss of Ann Rhoades, long-time library supporter, Lila's Legacy Society member, and volunteer, who passed away in November 2023, after a battle with pancreatic cancer.

Ann was a loyal donor to Bosler and the Friends of Bosler for many years. She retired from a long career in Dickinson College's Advancement Office in 2015, but it was only after her husband passed away in 2018, that she became more involved with the Library as a volunteer with both Bosler Library and the Bookery. She then joined Lila's Legacy Society in 2020 by



naming the Library in her will. More recently, Ann made a major gift to Bosler's Children's Learning Garden campaign. We are grateful for her generosity and thankful that she was able to tour the garden this past August and see the Yellow Brick Path and Bongo Drums that she named.

Her son Eric recently had this to say about his mother and her love of libraries.

"My Mother imparted her love of books and reading on me at an early age. There were frequent trips to the library when I was little to pick out new books for bedtime stories or to participate in the children's activities that were being hosted there. It was just a normal part of our routine and a frequent stop we would make. It wasn't until I was an adult that I realized what an important impact the Library had on her life, which is testament to why she dedicated the later years of her life giving back to the organization that gave so much to her."

Dennis Lavery Memorial Grant-in-Aid Annual Scholarship

The Friends of Bosler Library awards a \$2,000 scholarship each year to a student who lives in Bosler's service area and meets certain criteria. The following is a list of requirements for winning this grant.

Who May Apply:

Students who reside in one of the townships below, and either May 2024 Graduating High School students who are enrolled in an accredited college, or students currently enrolled in an accredited college with a 3.0 GPA, majoring in Library Science, Education, Journalism, Communications, or English. The applicant must be registered for at least 12 credits to be considered. Family members of the Friends Board or Board of Directors of Bosler Memorial Library are not eligible for this grant.

Carlisle Borough, Dickinson Township, Lower Frankford Township, Middlesex Township, North Middleton Township, South Middleton Township, Upper Frankford Township, West Pennsboro Township.
