



Thanks to the generosity of a number of anonymous donors, Bosler was able to purchase new subscriptions for **The New York Times** and the **Wall Street Journal**! The Journal is now available for you to come and read at the Library again; however, the Times delivery has not yet begun, but we expect to start receiving issues in the next week or two.

We are still waiting to find out the cost of reinstating a subscription to The Washington Post. Since the Post does not have regular delivery service in Carlisle, Bosler's only option for this newspaper is through Hudson News Distributors.
