

Folklore and Coal Mining Songs of the Northeast

Presented by: Jay Smar Thursday, September 7 from 6:00 pm to 7:30 pm

An informative yet musical and historical program with original and documented songs of this region during the early 1900's, highlighting the everyday struggles and life of the European coal miner in Northeastern Pennsylvania. Jay's grandfather mined coal in Schuylkill and Carbon County, PA for over 50 years. Songs sung by miners, recorded by folklorist/journalist, George Korson of Pottsville, PA, are performed as well as songs about more contemporary issues such as "The Fires of Centralia" documenting the 50 year old coal fire that burns to this day. Vocals are accompanied by guitar, claw-hammer banjo, and to emulate the mining musicians of this region, he sings, fiddles, and flat-foot clog-dances simultaneously to highlight the end of the program.



Beverley Eddy - The Psycho Boys: How a Unit of Refugees, Artists, and Professors Fought Back Against the Third Reich

Author Beverley Eddy presents a discussion on a little known piece of WWII history! They were not your typical World War II soldiers. Most were not in particularly good physical shape, and many had trouble handling their weapons. They differed widely in their ages, politics, and skills. Many worked in academia, media, and the arts. They were a strange mix of Americans and foreign nationals, immigrants, and refugees, linked by their language skills, knowledge of Europe, and a desire to defeat the Axis. During the war, the U.S. Army trained them in psychological warfare at a secret camp on the Gettysburg battlefield and then sent them to Europe. They became known as "Psycho Boys," a group of soldiers who have never received their due respect. In this book Beverley Driver Eddy, author of "Ritchie Boy Secrets," tells their rarely heard story, and shows the vital role they played in the Allied war effort."

Beverley Driver Eddy is Professor Emerita of German at Dickinson College. In her recent books -biographies and military histories -- she has been interested in showing how the lives of individuals intersect with cataclysmic events, especially with the upheavals of the Second World War. Most recently, she has published a double biography of Thomas Mann's two oldest children "Erika and Klaus Mann: Living with America" and the history of Camp Ritchie, Maryland "Ritchie Boy Secrets."

RIGHTING A WRONG

Japanese Americans and World War II

On display from September 12 to October 17 in the front lobby.

Righting a Wrong poster exhibition traces the story of Japanese national and Japanese American incarceration during World War II and the people who survived it. Young and old lived crowded together in hastily built camps, endured poor living conditions, and were under the constant watch of military guards for two and a half years. Meanwhile, brave Japanese American men risked their lives fighting for the United States. Some 40 years later, members of the Japanese American community led the nation to confront the wrong it had done—and urged Congress to make it right. Based on an original exhibition at

the National Museum of American History, the Righting a Wrong poster exhibition centers around eight core questions that encourage viewers to engage in a dialogue about how this happened and could it happen again. Embracing themes that are as relevant today as they were 75 years ago, the poster exhibition brings forth themes of identity, immigration, prejudice, civil rights, courage, and what it means to be an American.
