As March approaches, we're busy once again planning our summer programs. This year's theme is "Build a Better World." Stay tuned for details!

But until summer, we have plenty of programs to enrich your life. As always for children, Mrs. B and the Girl Scouts return with story times. On Wednesday mornings, we have drop-in story times. If you're looking for family fun, register for one of our Bingo for Books nights, or drop in on Fridays for fun with building sets, coloring, puzzles, trains, and board games. We also have a variety of upcoming craft programs, usually one per week - everything from animal crafts to wind chimes to painting sea shells. 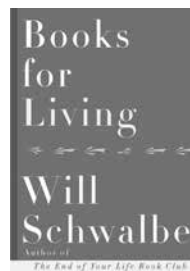

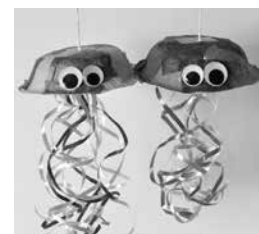

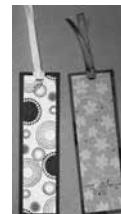
