

from the executive director



Each day at Joseph T. Simpson Public Library we work to fulfill our mission as a community center for learning and leisure. Educational and recreational programs for children, teens, and adults are held year-round. Check out our impressive list of program offerings on our website events calendar:

For the second year, the Beautify the Barriers community art project was embraced with creative and eye-catching artwork painted on the concrete barriers at the end of the library parking lot.

Leadership Cumberland selected Simpson Library as one of their community project sites in 2022, and a team of class participants compiled a comprehensive list of national and international holidays, month long awareness celebrations, and related book lists for us to use throughout the year. The purpose of Leadership Cumberland is to develop, promote, and inspire community-based leadership skills and encourage a deeper understanding and appreciation of Cumberland County. In June 2022, the library's Board of Trustees took a bold and exciting step by addressing limited programming space in the library with the purchase of the former Agway building at 45 West Allen Street. Half of the space has been converted into a permanent home for the Friends of the Joseph T. Simpson Public Library's Book Sale Center. The remaining half, consisting of unfinished warehouse space, will be renovated in the near future to provide additional library programming and meeting room space. I am very excited for the opportunities this new space will provide. As of March 2023, we have begun the process of launching a capital campaign to pay for the building renovations.

While Simpson Library receives major financial support from state, county, and municipal governments, we are not a government organization. Rather, we are an independent 501(C) nonprofit organization which depends on community support and donations. Each year we need to raise a minimum of \$250,000, or 25% of our operating budget, to continue providing library programs and services. The services and programs that enrich our community can't exist at the current level without your tax-deductible donations. Thank you for your support of the Joseph T. Simpson Public Library.

Purchased the Agway building at 45 West Allen Street for the permanent home of the Friends of the Library Book Sale and Donation Center and future library program and meeting room space.










