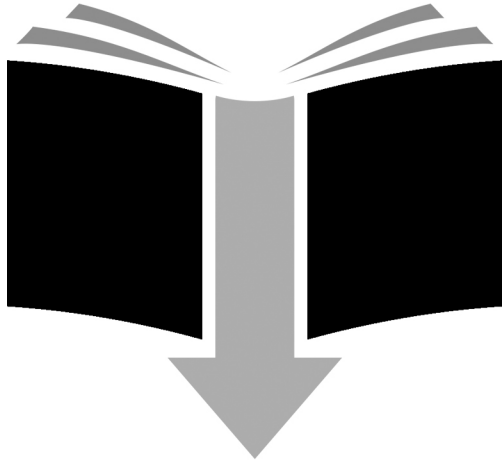
KANOPY CHRISTMAS MOVIE WATCH PARTY: THE MAN WHO INVENTED CHRISTMAS

Browse, search, and DISCOVER

There are thousands of ebooks and audiobooks, hand-selected by your library, available for reading. Explore the collection through catalog guides, subjects, featured titles, and curated lists. It's a delight to discover new books through Libby and Overdrive.

Did you know that you can have access to thousands of OverDrive eBooks and eAudiobooks? Borrow them, instantly, for free, with your phone or tablet using the Libby app from OverDrive. Using Libby, it only takes a few taps to find and borrow a title. Libby comes with an eBook reader and an audiobook player.

- Download eBooks and eAudiobooks for offline reading, or stream them to save space on your device.
- If you prefer to read on your Kindle, Libby can send your library books to it.
- All of your loans and holds are consolidated on a single shelf.
- Keep track of your reading history in the Activity tab.
- Positions, bookmarks and notes are kept in sync across your devices.
- Sample any book with just a tap - there's nothing to download or delete.
- You can try out zoomable graphic novels or picture books with read-along audio.

Five ways to enjoy films from Fredricksen in your home!

1. KANOPY

Residents of Cumberland County with Cumberland County Library Cards are able to stream 4 movies a month from Kanopy, our media streaming service.

Cumberland County residents can access a wide range of foreign films, documentaries, and classics through the popular on-demand film streaming service Kanopy. Films can be streamed from any computer, television, mobile device, or platform by downloading the Kanopy app for iOS, Android, AppleTV, Chromecast, or Roku. Loan periods allow patrons three days of unlimited viewing per film and simultaneous use. Videos are also accessible with captions, transcripts, and compatible with assistive technologies.

2. KANOPY KIDS

Kanopy now allows library patrons to access Kanopy Kids with unlimited plays for a rolling 30-days. Once a patron plays a Kanopy Kids video for more than 5 seconds, they

will have unlimited views of any videos in Kanopy Kids for the next 30 days. Go to: ccpa.kanopy.com/kids

3. OUR DVD COLLECTION

With over 17,000 movie and TV series titles in our collection, you'll be all set for those cozy winter nights to come!

4. FREDBOX

Fredbox is a faster way to watch in-demand DVDs rather than through the traditional checkout. For a \$2 rental fee (tax included), you can get the most in-demand movies for three days from fredbox. There are no reserves or renewals and fredbox DVDs must be returned to Fredricksen Library. Regular late fees apply (\$2.00 per DVD per day).

5. DVDS ON SALE DAILY

Check out the Friends of Fredricksen DVD display near the Circulation Desk with titles for adults and children on sale for only \$2 each. New titles added often!
